ON THE CASE OF CONFORMITY OF THE OBLIGATIONS STIPULATED BY THE PROTOCOL FOR PROHIBITION OF THE USE IN THE WAR OF ASPHYXIATING, POISONOUS OR OTHER GASES, AND OF BACTERIOLOGICAL METHODS OF WARFARE SIGNED ON 17 JUNE 1925 IN GENÈVE WITH THE CONSTITUTION OF THE REPUBLIC OF ARMENIA

Based on the review of the Case and governed by Point 2 of Article 100 and Parts 1 and 4 of Article 102 of the Constitution of the Republic of Armenia (with Amendments through 2005), Articles 63, 64 and 72 of the Law of the Republic of Armenia on the Constitutional Court, the Constitutional Court of the Republic of Armenia **HOLDS**:

- 1. The obligations stipulated by the Protocol for Prohibition of the Use in the War of Asphyxiating, Poisonous or other Gases, and of Bacteriological Methods of Warfare signed on 17 June 1925 in Genève are in conformity with the Constitution of the Republic of Armenia.
- 2. Pursuant to Part 2 of Article 102 of the Constitution of the Republic of Armenia (with Amendments through 2005) this Decision is final and enters into force from the moment of the announcement.
